National Assembly for Wales Finance Committee

On 20 January 2010, HEFCW gave evidence before the National Assembly for Wales's Finance Committee's Inquiry into the Funding of Post-16, Further and Higher Education.

Our purpose was to inform the Committee about the basic factual position of higher education (HE) in Wales and potential issues that would be raised by a significant reduction in income for Wales's universities. We noted that the HE sector has a good record of managing its finances through difficult times, and that we would expect institutions to make realistic assessments of their financial futures and adjust provision accordingly so that they continue to deliver their high quality teaching and research.

HEFCW's accompanying written submission to the Committee provided background information in support of the oral evidence, and referred to the role of universities in Wales's economy, including as employer and investor; and future challenges. It also explained how universities were funded, both via HEFCW and from other sources, including through student fees and commercial activities.

Matched funding scheme for voluntary giving

The Matched Funding Schemes in Wales and England give universities and colleges an opportunity to establish a culture of giving and embed development for the longer term.

The programmes aim to provide donors with an incentive to give, by enabling philanthropic income to go further by matching private funding with public funding.

Engaging with the Welsh Assembly Government's Economic Renewal Programme

In October 2009 the Welsh Assembly Government Minister for the Economy and Transport announced his intention to get Wales thinking about how it approaches economic development, and how Welsh Assembly Government departments need to work more effectively with partner organisations such as universities. We have already met twice with Assembly colleagues to look at the contributions both we and the HE sector could make to the exercise, and have been invited to continue to work with them over the coming months to offer our perspective on areas such as research activity, knowledge transfer and exchange, and commercialisation. The exercise is expected to conclude with advice to the Minister in July, with implementation commencing in September this year.

Welsh universities recognised for their commitment to young people from care

All of Wales's universities have now achieved the Frank Buttle Trust Quality Mark for Care Leavers in Higher Education. The Quality Mark recognises universities' commitment to providing support and additional funding for people of all ages with a care background, and identifies institutions which have improved care leavers' academic skills to succeed in school, college and university.

69 UK institutions have achieved the quality mark and Wales is the first part of the UK where all higher education institutions have been recognised in this way.

Information toolkit for higher education governors

Since HEFCW holds or has ready access to a wealth of statistics and performance information, we have collated and published an 'Information Toolkit' for higher education governing bodies, comprising:

- a range of reports showing the performance or position of the Welsh sector and individual institutions in a UK context;
- a handbook which identifies the range of existing useful data sources and information; and
- reports outlining the higher education sector's historical performance against Welsh Assembly Government targets set out under Reaching Higher, along with sector forecasts against the targets.

The material in the Toolkit is a selection of all data available to, and used by, institutions. While the main responsibility for providing such information to governing body members rests with the institutions, we hope that the Toolkit will supplement that information by giving governors a small selection of high level data showing institutions in Wales relative to all other UK institutions.

Next Council meeting The Welsh Assembly Government Minister responsible for higher education attends our Council meeting once a year. We are looking forward to welcoming the new Minister for Children, Education and Lifelong Learning, Leighton Andrews AM, to our next meeting on 12 March.

HEFCW's annual grant to the HE sector Wales will be discussed and will be confirmed at the next Council meeting in March. We plan to notify institutions of their final allocations for the 2010/11 academic year before the end of March.

Strategic dialogue meetings Twice a year, our Council and senior staff meet with the Welsh Vice-Chancellors' representative body Higher Education Wales (HEW), and the chairs of governing bodies, Chairs of Higher Education Wales (CHEW). The next 'Strategic Dialogue Meeting' is due to take place on the afternoon of 18 March at Aberystwyth University.

Over the next three months, we expect to:

- Consult on For our Future's recommendation that higher education in Wales is developed in the context of a regional planning and delivery structure.
- Publish our initial action plan based on the recommendations of For our Future, the Welsh Assembly Government's 21st Century Higher Education Strategy and Plan for Wales, and consult on our next Corporate Strategy.
- Provide funding, through JISC, to assist institutions in meeting strategic concerns in enhancing learning and teaching through the use of technology, building on, and learning from, the HEFCW-funded Gwella Programme. Information will be sent to Pro Vice-Chancellors for Learning and Teaching, or their equivalents.

Cyfarfodydd deialog strategol Ddwywaith y flwyddyn bydd ein Cyngor a staff uwch yn cyfarfod â'r corff sy'n cynrychioli Is-Gangellorion Cymru, Addysg Uwch Cymru (AUC), a chadeiryddion y cyrff llywodraethu, Cadeiryddion Addysg Uwch Cymru (CAUC). Cynhelir y 'Cyfarfod Deialog Strategol' nesaf yn y prynhawn ar 18 Mawrth ym Mhrifysgol Aberystwyth.

Yn ystod y tri mis nesaf, disgwyliwn:

- Ymgynghori ar argymhelliad Er Mwyn Ein Dyfodol y dylai addysg uwch yng Nghymru gael ei datblygu yng nghyd-destun strwythur cynllunio a gweithredu rhanbarthol.
- Cyhoeddi ein cynllun gweithredu cychwynnol ar sail yr argymhellion yn Er Mwyn Ein Dyfodol, Cynllun a Strategaeth Addysg Uwch yr 21^{ain} Ganrif i Gymru a luniwyd gan Lywodraeth Cynulliad Cymru, ac ymgynghori ar ein Strategaeth Gorfforaethol nesaf.
- Darparu cyllid, drwy JISC, i helpu sefydliadau i gwrdd â nodau strategol ym maes defnyddio technoleg i wella dysgu ac addysgu, gan adeiladu ar Raglen Gwella CCAUC a dysgu oddi wrthi. Anfonir gwybodaeth i'r Is-Gangellorion Dysgu ac Addysgu, neu swyddogion cyfwerth.
