#### INITIAL TEACHER TRAINING (ITT) INTAKE TARGETS AND RELATED ISSUES

I wrote to you on 4 December 2006 giving sector ITT intake targets for both primary and secondary provision in 2007/08 (Circular W06/54HE). The letter confirmed that the intake targets for 2007/08 remained the same as the indicative targets for the period to 2010/11 which the Welsh Assembly Government gave in their letter of 5 July. Institutional primary intake targets were published on 25 January 2007 (Circular W07/02HE).

#### Secondary ITT intake targets 2007/08

For institutional secondary intake targets, the Assembly Government asked us to put proposals to them by the end of January for approval. We have now received this approval and I am able to inform you of your institution's secondary ITT intake targets for 2007/08.

The secondary intake targets are set out at Annex A. You will recall from Circular W06/54HE that Secondary PGCE targets are broken down into Priority Group 1 (Mathematics and Science), Priority Group 2 (Other shortage subjects), Other subjects. In determining allocations for 2007/08, we have made adjustments to targets within and between subject areas, taking into account:

- sector recruitment performance in individual subject areas in 2006/07 and in previous years;
- individual institutional recruitment performance against intake targets in 2006/07 and in previous years;
- the need to balance subject provision across the sector, and to maintain the viability of provision;
- evidence from Estyn of the quality of training provided by institutions.

We remain committed to working with institutions to meet Assembly secondary intake targets for ITT, particularly in shortage subjects. In making intake target allocations, we regard an allocation of 10 intakes as the minimum for a viable cohort. Where an institution is consistently having difficulty recruiting to this level in particular subjects, we will expect to discuss future arrangements and action with the providers concerned as part of our continuing discussions on reconfiguration.

## Released numbers from ITT intake target reductions

In responding to us on our proposals for secondary targets, the Assembly Government has asked us to note or remind you of various points in relation to numbers released as a result of the reductions in intake targets:

- that we let you know at this stage the ITT numbers allocated to you in 2006/07, at primary and secondary level, which are not being used for ITT in 2007/08. Thus the difference in intake targets between 2006/07 and 2007/08 for individual institutions is set out in Annex B.
- that planning for reconfiguration in a way which can keep the current level of resources available to providers involves sensible re-use of former ITT numbers in other HE-education related work in the categories set out in its May 2006 remit letter to the Council for ITT reconfiguration.
- as a firm and detailed plan for ITT reconfiguration is still to be agreed, the Welsh Assembly Government would wish to see the following situation for 2007/08, as an interim measure:
  - ITT numbers allocated in 2006/07 which are not being utilised for ITT in 2007/08 remain with the institution;
  - if an institution wishes to utilise some or all of these numbers for other courses in 2007/08, they should be re-used for other HE education-related courses which fit with the categories set out in Assembly May 2006 remit letter;
  - planning for re-use in this way should be done on the basis that some at least of the alternative course numbers may have to be switched in subsequent years to other areas, depending on how ITT reconfiguration develops – flexibility will be key.

The table in Annex B will give you an indication of the possible numbers available. However, the conversion of these numbers into the appropriate, cost-neutral, number of funded credits will be confirmed later, probably at the time of the overall recurrent grant announcement for 2007/08. The number of funded credits available will be dependent on the Academic Subject Category in which they are placed. Given the emphasis by the Assembly-Government of using these resources for other HE-education related work, we would expect this to be primarily ASC 11b. However, this may not be the case in all instances and we will contact you shortly to discuss this further with you.
