

STATISTICS FOR 2005/06 FUNDING

SUMMARY

The main points are:

- there were 113,219 enrolments (including postgraduate research) in 2004/05;
- 98,615 (87 per cent) of the enrolments were fundable by the Higher Education Funding Council for Wales (HEFCW);
- there were 8,691,356 fundable undergraduate and postgraduate taught credit values in 2004/05;
- the 58,400 fundable full-time and sandwich undergraduate and postgraduate taught enrolments gave rise to 7,030,259 credit values;
- the 37,986 fundable part-time undergraduate and postgraduate taught enrolments gave rise to 1,661,097 credit values;
- the greatest numbers of fundable full-time and sandwich year out taught credit values were in *Science* (1,420,693) and *Humanities* (1,183,210);
- the greatest numbers of fundable full-time research enrolments were in *Science* (642) and the largest numbers of fundable part-time postgraduate research enrolments were in *Humanities* (233);
- the largest numbers of fundable part-time taught credit values were in *Business and Management* (312,032) and *Humanities* (227,433);
- full-time/sandwich fundable taught credit values have risen slightly by 0.6 per cent since 2003/04. Full-time fundable postgraduate research enrolments have risen by 3 per cent since 2003/04. For part-time provision there has been a 2 per cent increase in fundable taught credits and a 7 per cent decrease in fundable postgraduate research enrolments;
- the subjects with the highest growth levels for fundable full-time and sandwich year out taught credit values were *Built Environment* (13 per cent) and *Clinical and Pre-Clinical Subjects* (13 per cent);
- fundable part-time provision grew most in *Clinical and Pre-Clinical Subjects* (356 per cent);
- the only subjects with growth for fundable part-time undergraduate franchised out provision were *Built Environment* (65 per cent) and *Business and Management* (1 per cent);
