Introduction

1. This circular sets out the allocations for 2012/13 to support the implementation of Reaching Wider (RW) Partnership Strategies and provides additional information on related policy developments.

Background

2. Reaching Wider Partnerships were funded between 2002/03 and 2010/11 against funding proposals. Circular W11/01HE set out our reasons for moving to funding against three-year strategies and our expectation that:

'Reaching Wider Partnerships will be a key mechanism of the higher education regional strategies in delivering widening access across the regions'. (p1).

- 3. In addition to this new relationship with the regional HE Strategy groups, from 2011/12 the Reaching Wider Partnerships' role includes:
 - Responding to regional needs and priorities as evidenced by local labour market intelligence and higher education regional strategies;
 - Responding flexibly to Welsh Government agendas relating to social justice and supporting a buoyant economy;
 - Partnership working with Further Education colleges, Communities First partnerships and other organisations which is multi-sectoral, long-term, genuine and effective;
 - Working with people of all ages from Communities First areas;
 - Working to support the education and skills of looked after children, care leavers and their carers; and
 - Promoting the Reaching Wider Programme regionally and nationally.
- 4. We requested Reaching Wider Strategies from the three Reaching Wider Partnerships for the period 2011/12 to 2013/14 in the summer of 2011 and announced RW Strategy allocations for the first year of the strategy period¹.

2012/13 allocations

- 5. The total sum available for the Reaching Wider Programme for 2012/13 is £2,023,793.
- 6. Due to budget constraints, in 2012/13 all HEFCW programme budgets have been reduced by 5.8%. In 2011/12 the RW Programme budget was £2,148,400.
- 7. The RW Partnership allocations in this strategy period comprise three elements:

- i. 15% of the total RW allocation for the number of Communities First areas in each partnership region;
- ii. 15% of the total RW allocation for the number of Communities First students as a proportion of the total Welsh domiciled students in the regional partner HEIs;² and
- iii. 70% of the funding allocation based on the Partnership's 2010/11 allocation. The 2010/11 allocation will be used as the base-year for future calculations.
- 8. In 2011/12 we set aside £5k from the RW Programme budget for University of Wales Trinity Saint David to use in the Communities First area of 'Upland villages in the Tregaron area (parts of Melindwr, Lledrod, Tregaron and Llangeitho electoral divisions'. This funding, allocated via the South West Wales Partnership, recognised the University's existing RW commitments in these areas. From 2012/13 we expect the North and Mid Wales Reaching Wider Partnership to manage RW provision in this area, working with other providers, as appropriate.
- 9. The Open University in Wales is a member of all three HE regional RW Partnerships and engages in each region. We expect to see the further involvement of the Open University in Wales in RW activities in each region and for it to be enabled to contribute fully.
- 10. The allocations for 2012/13 are set out in Annex A.
- 11. Please note that, in the light of uncertainties regarding the level of HEFCW's fee grant commitments, the allocations provided in Annex A are **provisional and subject to change in-year.** We will inform Partnerships of any changes as soon as possible.

Annual Monitoring Statements

- RW Partnerships will be asked to report on progress in 2011/12 and to provide targets and expenditure plans for 2012/13 in their Annual Monitoring Statements (AMSs).
- 13. Circular W12/21HE, published in early June requested Reaching Wider annual monitoring statements, as part of our annual request for institutional strategic plans and financial and student forecast data³. The Partnerships' individualised RW AMS have been sent separately to RW Partnership Managers in early July for return by **the end of October 2012**.

Policy Developments

- 14. In this Strategy period, the Reaching Wider Programme priorities remain as set out in our original RW Strategy guidance and summarised in paragraph three above. However, since the submission of the Reaching Wider Partnership Strategies there have been a number of new and emerging policies and priorities which Partnerships will want to take into account when implementing Strategies and confirming outcomes for 2012/13 through the AMS process:
 - **HEFCW's remit letter** for 2012-13 which sets out the Welsh Government's priorities for HEFCW's work⁴.
 - Communities First cluster developments. Our remit letter for 2012-13 welcomed our continued focus on Communities First areas and its expectation that we will work 'with the new Communities First clusters and regional programme boards as they develop'. Reaching Wider Partnerships are well-placed to engage in CF cluster developments.
 - **HEFCW's Child Poverty Strategy**⁵. We published our Child Poverty Strategy in March 2012 and we confirmed that we will manage our contribution to the eradication of child poverty through our widening access policy area, including the Reaching Wider Programme. We recognise that, among other activities, Reaching Wider provision supports children's transition from primary to secondary school and parents' participation in family learning activities.
 - Education Maintenance Allowance (EMA). The Welsh
 Government's Programme of Government identifies a measure for
 the percentage of EMA recipients progressing to higher education.
 Partnerships will want to consider ways of identifying and tracking
 EMA recipients from CF areas through RW provision and onto HE⁶.
 - Learning Record Service. Pupils aged 14 years, Welsh
 Baccalaureate students and work-based learners are being
 registered by learning providers with unique learner numbers (ULN).
 We encourage the Partnerships develop systems to collect ULNs, to
 inform their monitoring and reporting systems.
 - Development of HEFCW's Corporate Strategy 2013-14 to 2015-16. In 2012-13 we will consult on our new Corporate Strategy. This Corporate Strategy will continue to deliver Welsh Government expectations set out in *For our Future*. Partnerships might want to contribute to this consultation, including on strategic priorities relating to widening access.

Payment of allocations

15. RW Strategy Fund allocations will be paid in two equal instalments in September 2012 and March 2013. We will confirm release of the March 2013 payment
